



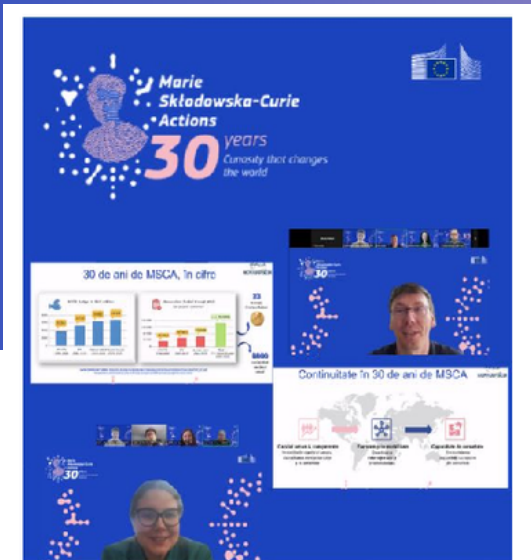
30 Years of MSCA: Inspiring Romanian Researchers

Executive summary



The anniversary event **“30 Years of MSCA: Inspiring Romanian Researchers”** was successfully organised online on 22 April 2026 by MSCA National Contact Points in Romania at UEFISCDI, as part of the celebration of three decades of the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions. The event brought together representatives of the European Commission, the Romanian MSCA National Contact Point team, researchers, alumni, supervisors, beneficiaries, and members of the Romanian research and innovation community.

Designed to highlight both the strategic relevance and the human dimension of MSCA, the event offered to the 120 participants an overview of the key novelties and updates in the MSCA 2026-2027 programme, alongside insights into Romania’s participation in MSCA.

The event combined presentations, roundtable discussions, an interactive audience poll, short video testimonials and Q&A sessions. These contributions created a dynamic and engaging format, encouraging dialogue between experienced beneficiaries and researchers interested in future MSCA opportunities.

Overall, the discussions clearly reinforced **the importance of MSCA for Romania**, not only as a funding instrument, but as a strategic driver for developing research talent, increasing international visibility, and integrating Romanian institutions into the international research area.

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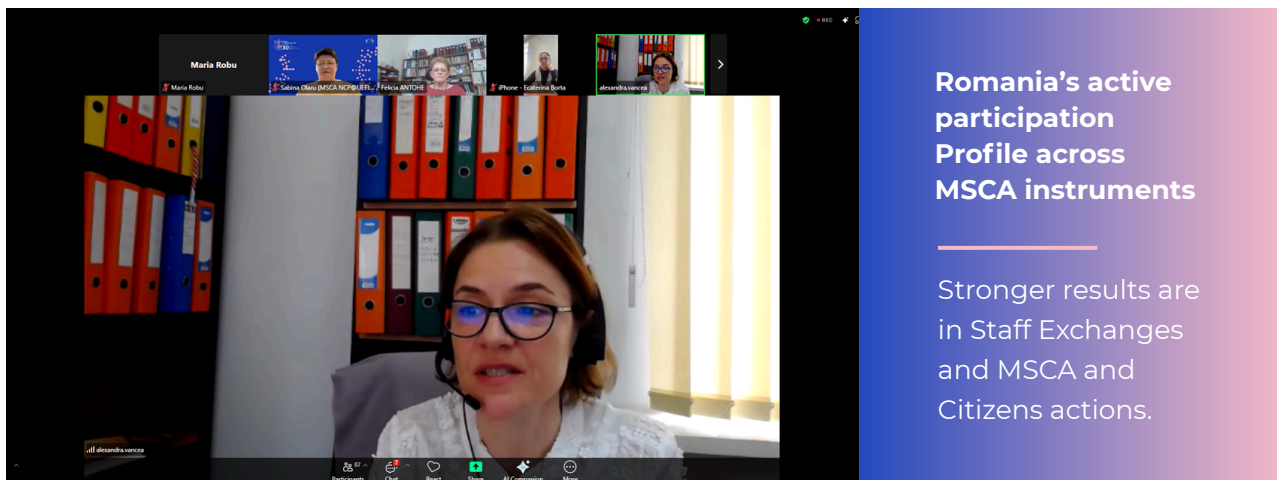

Opening remarks & national perspective

Introductory remarks

The event opened with introductory remarks that highlighted:

- the significance of the 30-year MSCA anniversary as a flagship European programme for scientific excellence and mobility
- the role of MSCA in supporting research careers, mobility and skills development
- the relevance of the programme for Romanian researchers and institutions
- the value of connecting national participation with European-level opportunities.



National perspective

The welcome and national perspective were delivered by **Alexandra Vancea**, MSCA Programme Committee member, National Authority for Research, and focused on the following ideas:

- For Romania, MSCA has been an important European instrument for international connection, helping researchers build partnerships, develop their careers and increase the visibility of Romanian research.
- Success in MSCA also depends on proposal-writing culture, institutional capacity and continuous support, especially in Widening countries.
- The full-time NCP model in Romania was highlighted as a positive step, supporting applicants and strengthening national participation in the programme.
- The anniversary moment offers an opportunity to reflect on achievements and prepare for future participation.

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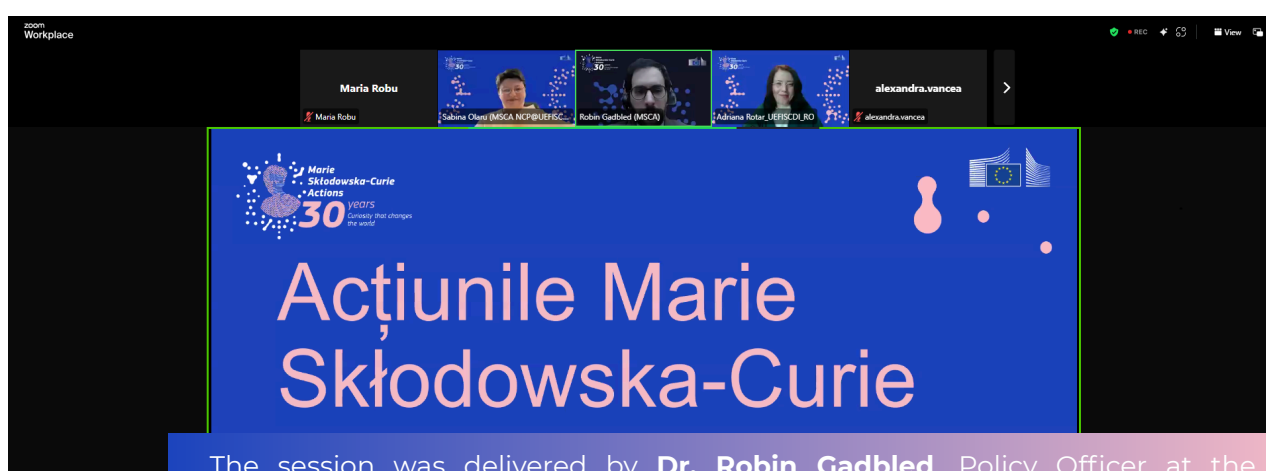


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MSCA 2026–2027 updates & overview

The presentation focused on the MSCA 2026–2027 programme overview highlighting MSCA as a highly competitive and prestigious European programme built around research excellence, mobility and collaboration.

Key novelties and updates in MSCA 2026-2027



The session was delivered by **Dr. Robin Gadbled**, Policy Officer at the European Commission, DG EAC, Unit C2: Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions, and was followed by Q&A.

Key topic	Main points highlighted
Bottom-up approach	The programme allows researchers to develop projects based on their own scientific ideas, curiosity and research interests
Collaboration dimensions	All MSCA actions include strong international, interdisciplinary and intersectoral dimensions
Main MSCA actions	The presentation covered Doctoral Networks, Postdoctoral Fellowships, Staff Exchanges, COFUND and the new Choose Europe for Science pilot
Staff Exchanges simplifications	Presented as an accessible entry point into MSCA, supporting collaborative projects through staff secondments; recent simplifications were introduced to make the action more attractive and easier to implement
Choose Europe for Science	Presented as a new initiative supporting the attraction and retention of excellent research talent in Europe

Moreover, the presentation underlined the importance of stable career perspectives, transparent recruitment and strong institutional support for researchers.

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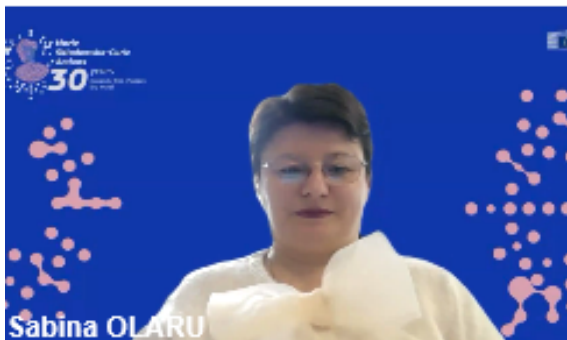

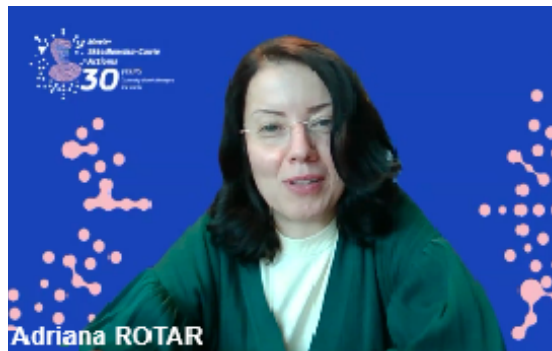

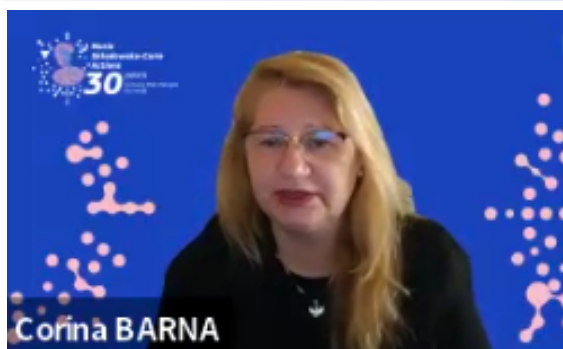
Romania's participation profile

Roundtable discussion: From Romania to Europe and beyond - Building research careers with MSCA

The roundtable discussion brought to the forefront concrete experiences and personal reflections on how participation in MSCA projects contributes to the development of research careers, the expansion of international collaborations, and the strengthening of institutional capacity.

The roundtable was organised around **four thematic clusters**. The format encouraged complementary interventions, enabling each speaker to contribute a distinct perspective to the discussion.

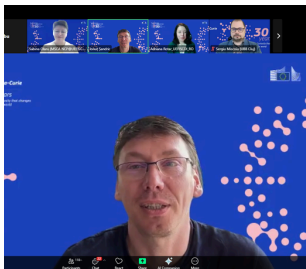
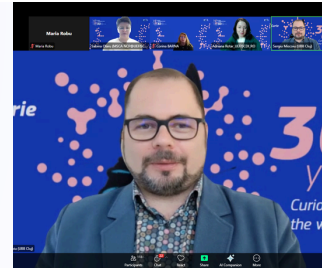

*Sergiu Miscoiu underlined the contribution of MSCA projects to **strengthening institutional and managerial research capacity**, through the consolidation of epistemic and methodological communities, while **generating a multiplier effect across future generations**.*



*Ionuț Șandric highlighted the added value of MSCA Staff Exchanges in **building international and intersectoral networks** and in generating new partnerships, opening access to further Horizon Europe funding, and offering **valuable mobility and training opportunities for doctoral and postdoctoral researchers**.*

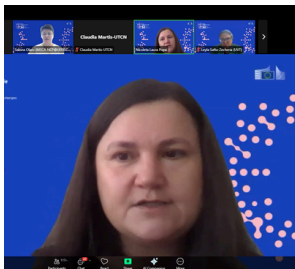
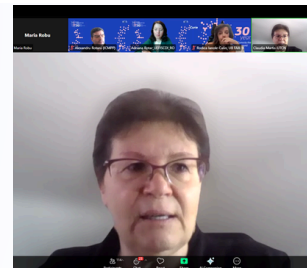
Both perspectives confirmed that MSCA creates value beyond the project itself, through stronger expertise, new collaborations and lasting professional impact.

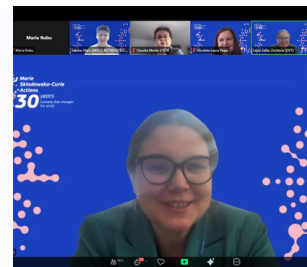

*Claudia Martis highlighted the value of MSCA industry-academia projects in **strengthening industry cooperation, opening new research directions and creating long-term partnerships**, while offering doctoral researchers valuable real-world research experience.*



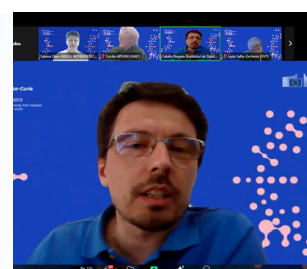
*Nicoleta Laura Popa underlined MSCA's role in **strengthening the international visibility** of Alexandru Ioan Cuza University of Iași, while offering young researchers access to interdisciplinary teams, research infrastructure, **intercultural learning and co-creation in mixed research teams**.*

*Leyla Safta-Zecheria described MSCA as a **transformative experience that can create unexpected long-term impacts**, acting as a catalyst for career development, interdisciplinary learning and transsectoral collaboration across disciplines, sectors and contexts.*



*Cecilia Arsene highlighted how her Marie Curie experience broadened her scientific horizons, **strengthened her professional maturity** and contributed to major institutional impact, including valuable research infrastructure and an integrated aerosol research centre in Romania.*

*Cătălin Negrea described MSCA as a valuable experience for focusing on quality research, gaining international recognition and **strengthening proposal-writing skills**, while encouraging future applicants not to be discouraged by previous unsuccessful funding attempts.*

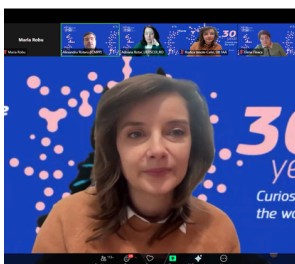
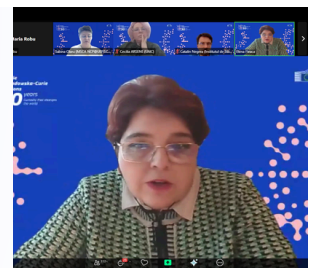

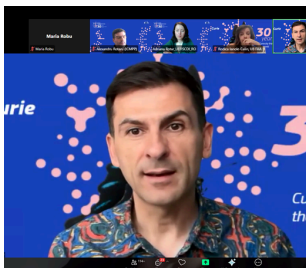
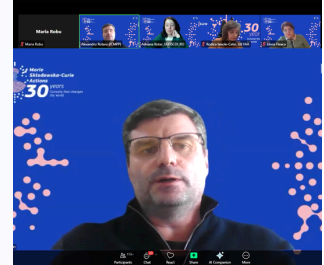
*Elena Fleacă highlighted MSCA Staff Exchanges as a valuable instrument for improving international collaboration and strengthening intersectoral links between academia and companies, while noting **challenges in company engagement**, secondment planning and interdisciplinarity.*



*Rodica Ianole-Călin described how MSCA projects **strengthen intersectoral learning** by shifting collaboration towards more concrete impact, faster working rhythms and a **more dynamic approach to career and mobility management**.*

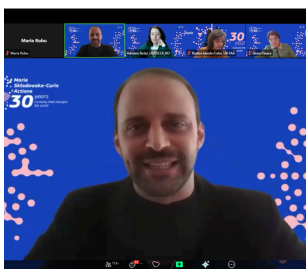
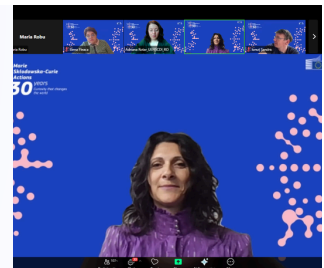
Thematic cluster 3 - Particularities of the MSCA experience

Alexandru Rotaru referred to MSCA Staff Exchanges as a valuable framework for academia–industry collaboration, giving doctoral and postdoctoral researchers **direct exposure to applied research and broader career perspectives**.



Dan Vodnar highlighted MSCA's role in **building stronger working networks**, improving academia–industry communication and increasing methodological flexibility, while **creating trust-based relationships** that lead to new collaborations and follow-up projects.

Codruța Mare emphasised the role of MSCA Industrial Doctoral Networks in connecting doctoral researchers with the business sector, **providing structured access to industry** and generating benefits for doctoral candidates, supervisors and the wider doctoral school.



Daniel Cruceriu presented MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships as a valuable opportunity for early-career researchers to **focus on high-level research**, gain advanced training and European recognition, while opening paths to international collaboration and future funding.

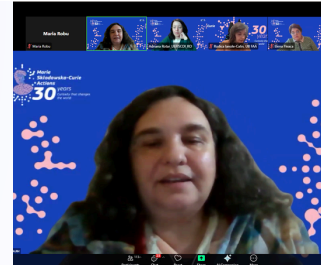
Overall, the discussion showed that MSCA projects create lasting value by strengthening international and intersectoral collaboration, developing researchers' skills and careers, and supporting more mature, connected and impactful research communities.

*Maria Boștenaru Dan described MSCA as a lasting experience that **strengthened her project management, intercultural communication and networking skills**, while opening further opportunities in research, evaluation, science communication and international collaboration.*



The discussion showed that MSCA experiences strengthen key skills beyond research, including project management, multicultural leadership, intercultural communication, networking and resilience in complex international contexts. Participants also underlined that MSCA creates lasting opportunities, offering researchers the freedom to pursue high-quality research, build long-term collaborations and gain international recognition well beyond the project itself.



A total of 14 experts participated in the roundtable discussion, sharing diverse MSCA experiences as coordinators, beneficiaries, supervisors, fellows and researchers. The discussion confirmed that MSCA can significantly shape individual research careers, create long-term scientific and professional networks, and generate lasting effects at institutional level.

Key takeaways from the roundtable

The roundtable highlighted **MSCA as a strong catalyst for career development**, international collaboration and institutional learning. Participants underlined that MSCA experiences go beyond mobility and funding, as they can significantly reshape individual research careers, generate long-term institutional effects, strengthen research networks, improve project management and leadership skills, and increase international visibility.

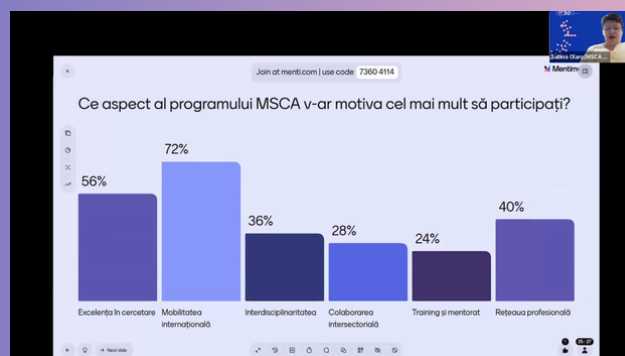
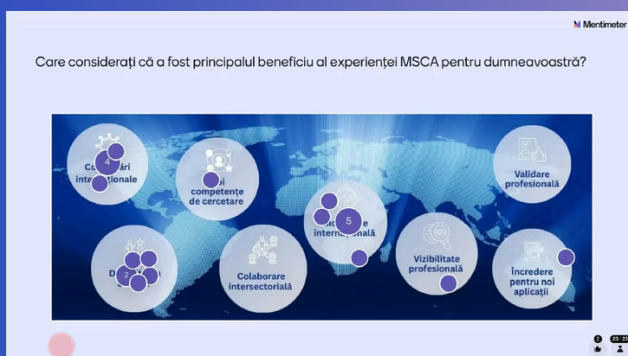
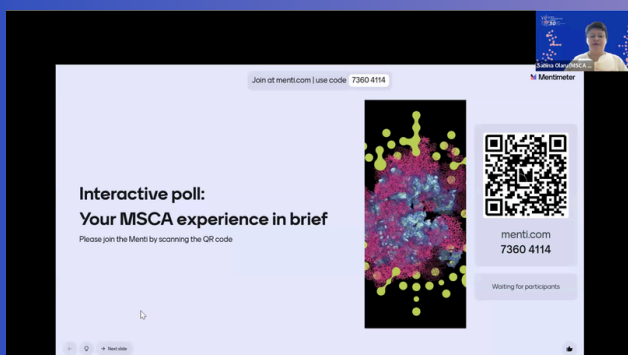
The discussion also pointed to MSCA's role in shaping new generations of researchers, particularly through doctoral and postdoctoral opportunities, secondments and exposure to interdisciplinary and intersectoral environments. While participants noted practical challenges, especially related to funding levels, coordination of secondments and the involvement of industry partners, the overall message was clear: **beyond the diversity of individual experiences, MSCA brings broader skills, stronger collaborations and lasting value for researchers, institutions and wider research ecosystems.**

Interactive poll highlights

The event also included an interactive poll designed to actively involve participants and capture their immediate perceptions, expectations and experiences related to MSCA.

- “**Collaboration**” was the word most frequently associated with MSCA, followed by community, performance, mobility and career.
- The most visible benefits identified by participants were **career development, international mobility and new international collaborations**.
- Future applicants were among the most active respondents, showing a strong interest in MSCA opportunities.
- Participants identified **research excellence, professional networking and mobility** as key motivations for future involvement.

Overall, the poll reinforced the roundtable's key message: MSCA creates lasting value beyond funding, supporting researchers' careers, strengthening international and intersectoral collaboration, and contributing to institutional development.

The national event “**30 Years of MSCA: Inspiring Romanian Researchers**” successfully marked the 30-year anniversary of the Marie Skłodowska-Curie Actions in Romania. By bringing together the European Commission, National Contact Points, researchers, alumni, supervisors, beneficiaries and coordinators, the event created a meaningful space for information exchange, dialogue and community building.

Event insights: benefits of MSCA participation

Building on the main insights of the event, the discussions and video testimonials showed that MSCA creates value at several levels: for individual researchers, host institutions, supervisors, partners and the wider research and innovation ecosystem.

For doctoral and postdoctoral researchers

Transformative opportunity offering mobility, time and resources for high-quality research, access to international and intersectoral environments, stronger skills, formal recognition and clearer future career paths.

For organisations and host institutions

Contribution to stronger international visibility, increased research capacity and European project management expertise, while turning occasional collaborations into long-term international partnerships.

For supervisors, coordinators and research teams

Development of leadership, mentoring, project and risk management, and intercultural communication skills, while requiring flexibility across institutions, sectors and disciplines.

For non-academic partners

Connection between research and real-world needs supports applied solutions, knowledge transfer, public engagement and stronger links with users, communities and professional environments.

For the wider research and innovation ecosystem

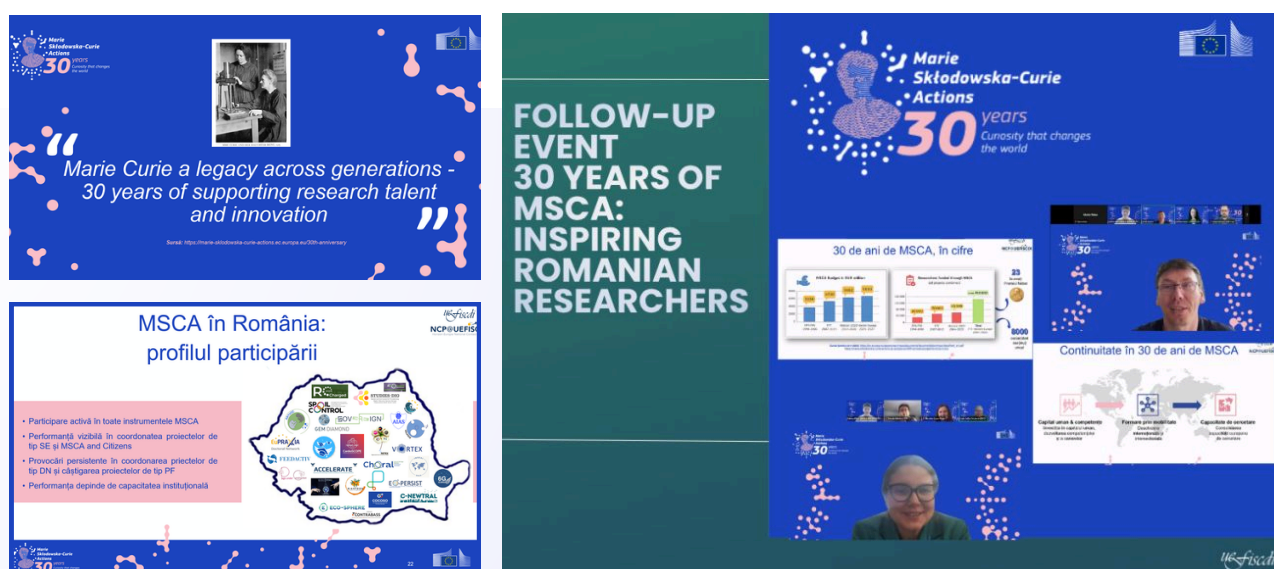
